




Nine students completed the Garage Project after a 5 week course, where they learned about changing brake pads, basic servicing and maintaining a safe road vehicle. Great work!



Our student ambassadors across all subject areas play an important role in providing guidance and support to younger students in their studies as they embody successful practice.


