

What we do...


- The Pastoral Care Team works together to help students who are experiencing difficulty in their lives.

- The PC Team brings all of the school support services together to support the student in all areas of their school life in a caring and empathetic manner.




Additional Supports...

This was aimed at all 426 students in the RCS.








A visual of the proposed new entrance which will be constructed in the RCS.



The school currently has over 500 chromebook devices among students and staff and all classrooms have interactive technology. The school facilities are fully wifi enabled and can support 1500 e-devices at 100mb speeds.
